### MP Daryl Kramp Announces Important Investment through the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program

MP Daryl Kramp, on behalf of the Honourable Gary Goodyear, Minister for the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario (FedDev Ontario), today announced that the Corporation of the Township of Frontenac Islands will receive funding through the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program.

By improving community infrastructure such as the Wolfe Island Community Hall, we are helping to boost economic activity and maintain a high quality of life for residents of all ages.”

“We are very pleased that funding provided through the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program to assist the municipality of Frontenac Islands in renovating and modernizing our historic Community Hall on Wolfe Island, which was built in 1859, has been approved. The Harper Government has approved up to \$53,350 for a total project cost of up to \$106,700 for renovation of the Wolfe Island Community Hall.

This announcement is one of many for projects approved through the Program that will improve and preserve community spaces across southern Ontario, with the aim of giving back to Canadians and creating a lasting legacy as Canada prepares to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Confederation in 2017. The Program is expected to boost economic activity through infrastructure investments, build community-based partnerships and modernize existing community facilities. The contribution is contingent on the execution of a contribution agreement with the recipient.

Projects have been selected based on program criteria, including the extent to which funding was leveraged from other sources, construction-readiness, and linkages to Canada 150. The Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program is one of several infrastructure-related initiatives that the Harper Government has undertaken to generate well-being and prosperity in communities across Canada. It builds on FedDev Ontario's delivery of the Community Infrastructure Improvement Fund and the Recreational Infrastructure Canada Program in Ontario, which represented a federal investment of more than \$225 million and supported more than 1180 projects.
